



Windsor Parks, Recreation & Culture Department 2026 Tree Sale Information

The Windsor Tree Board is pleased to offer our reduced cost Tree Sale again this year. This project is part of an ongoing effort to beautify the Town of Windsor with trees to help clean our air, shade our streets and sidewalks, reduce energy consumption, and add beauty. Trees absorb pollutants and protect homes from harsh temperatures and rough winds. They control soil erosion and storm water while improving property values. Year-round, trees can make life in our town healthier, more beautiful, and more comfortable.

Tree Information:

Air Pot Container trees will be sold for \$80 each. Trees will be approx. 5' – 10' tall and 3/4" – 1" in diameter. The tree species being offered are listed on the next page. You may purchase up to three (3) trees, provided you meet the planting and spacing requirements as well as the residency requirements. Proof of residency in Windsor may be met by providing a copy of your water bill or proof of payment of Windsor property taxes.

How to order:

1. Make your selection of tree(s) and fill out the 2026 Tree Order Form.
Please note: There will be a limited number of each species. Requests will be granted in the order in which they are received. **The deadline for orders is Wednesday, April 15, 2026.**
2. Drop off your order form, proof of residency and payment to: Windsor Community Recreation Center; 250 N. 11th Street, Windsor, CO, 80550, OR scan and email the request form to windsorpr@windsorgov.com. You will receive a phone call to confirm. You may pay for the trees over the phone with a credit card, or take a check made payable to the "Town of Windsor" to the recreation center.
3. **Pick up your tree(s) on Saturday, April 18th between 10:00am and 12:00pm at the Public Services facility at 922 North 15th Street, Windsor, CO, 80550.**

Planting and spacing requirements:

- Trees must be planted immediately after pickup.
- Please see plant list below for required spacing requirements for trees at maturity.
- For public safety along the street: Trees need to be 10ft. from driveways, alleys and fire hydrants; 40ft. from a corner intersection; 20ft. from a streetlight or stop sign.
- Please plant your trees at least 5ft. from buried power lines and 10ft. from water and sewer lines. To have buried power, water & sewer lines located call 8-1-1 or make a request online at: <https://colorado811.org/>.
